



## Summer 2014 IARU Student Sustainability Fellowship and Exchange

### Participating Institutions

### Goal

*Student Sustainability Fellowships* will provide selected students with the opportunity to work on targeted campus sustainability projects at IARU member institutions. Projects will be institutional specific, however developed with the intention that lessons learned that can be applied at both the home and the host institution. *Sustainability Fellowships* are intended to target a broad range of disciplines ranging from the arts to engineering.

### Timeframe

The student exchange will take place for a six to eight week period between June 17th until the end of September. **The hosting Universities 2014 for the two ETH students is Oxford or YALE University.**

### Framework

*Student Sustainability Fellows* will work a standard [35+ hour] work week in the Sustainability or related office of participating institutions and live in housing provided by the host institution. Selected students will be matched upon arrival at host institution with projects based upon skill, interest and background. Supervision and oversight will be provided to the students throughout their stay. Students will have access to all the resources required to complete their projects. ### Application process

Send a short application no later than **March 15th, 2014**, including

- short CV
- possible timeframe for fellowship
- expertise and interests in sustainable campus
